

# Back in The 2000s

## IN THE NEWS

**2000:** The Millennium Dome opened provisionally for one year. The century also starts with the 'millennium bug' – a cyber threat to world technology that proved to be futile!

**2001:** The twin towers of the World Trade Centre in New York fell to the ground when two hijacked planes were flown into them on September 11th. The world's worst terrorist attack claimed nearly 3,000 lives.

**2002:** Queen Elizabeth II celebrated 50 years on the throne. The Queen mother and her sister Princess Margaret also died this year.

**2003:** The Space Shuttle disaster happened on 1st February when the craft disintegrated upon re-entry killing all seven astronauts on board.

The highest temperature ever recorded was taken at Faversham in Kent at 101.3°F, 38.5°C. In France, temperatures soared as high as 111.4°F, 44.1°C and contributed directly to the death of an estimated 15,000 people.

**2004:** A Tsunami in the Indian Ocean on Boxing day caused mass devastation and thousands lost their lives including 150 Britons.

The Millennium Stadium in Cardiff was opened in November.

**2005:** Hurricane Katrina struck the US state of Louisiana. 80% of the city of New Orleans was flooded and 1600 perished.

The London bombings shook the transport network. A bus and an underground station were hit.

**2006:** Google purchased YouTube for US \$1.65 billion in stock.

Twitter was launched in San Francisco.

**2007:** British troops withdrew from Basra in Iraq.

The New Wembley Stadium was completed. Princes William and Harry organised a charity concert as a tribute to their mother on the tenth anniversary of her death.

**2008:** Missing schoolgirl Shannon Matthews is found alive, her mother Karen is later arrested for her kidnap.

Heather Mills filed a £24.3 million divorce case against her estranged husband Sir Paul McCartney, but lost her case.

London got a new Lord Mayor, Boris Johnson.

**2009:** Michael Jackson died on June 25th. He was the most successful entertainer/pop star of the modern era.

Britain's largest ever haul of Anglo-Saxon treasure was found by a metal detectorist in Staffordshire.

**Athletics:** KELLY HOLMES became the first female double Olympic champion in 2004 in Athens winning Gold at 800m and 1500m

USAIN BOLT set a World record for the 100m in the 2008 Olympics running 9.69

**Motor Racing:** MICHAEL SCHUMACHER won 5 FI titles in a row. LEWIS HAMILTON won the first of his many titles in 2008

**County Cricket:** SURREY(2), DURHAM (2), and SUSSEX (3) were the most dominant sides

**Tennis:** ROGER FEDERER dominated Wimbledon with Rafael Nadal a close second. The WILLIAMS sisters VENUS and SERENA took every title except two.
